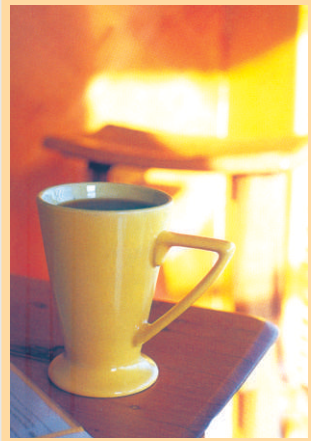

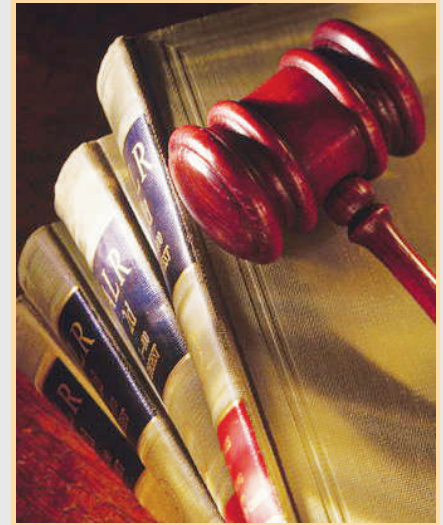

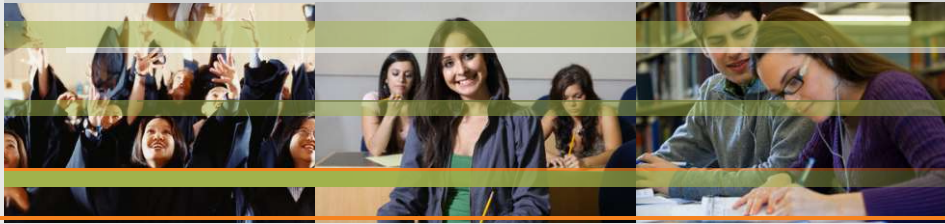

● JUDICIAL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS

Preparation for Judicial Service Examination is vastly different from the preparation for an entrance examination. Judicial service examination calls for a comprehensive understanding of law and legal principles.
